Los Angeles Downtown Industrial District (LADID) is the largest industrial and manufacturing district in the City of Los Angeles. It encompasses a 36 block district between Fourth (on the north) and Eighth (on the south) Streets, San Pedro (on the west) and Alameda (on the east) Streets.

Over 140 properties lie within the LADID boundaries. It is primarily a manufacturing and wholesale area providing seafood, produce and food services, as well as garment and printing businesses. The historic Fisherman's Outlet is just one of several restaurants that attract thousands of customers daily. The district also is home to the Inner City Arts program for children.

Safety and security is the number one concern in the Industrial District. The LADID BID program provides a Safety Team to address those concerns. The Safety Team's mission is to ensure public safety, provide security to businesses and property, and to generally furnish friendly assistance to people in the district. The Safety Team is on duty 24 hours a day and sits in on the Wednesday morning crime control meetings conducted by the Los Angeles Police Department Central and Newton Divisions.

Maintenance and safety are almost always linked. The LADID BID program provides regular "Clean Team" services to the District. The Clean Team keeps sidewalks clean, carts away trash and removes graffiti. Their efforts send a message that the Industrial District is a safe, comfortable and clean place to conduct business.
